SERVICES OFFERED TO RESIDENTS

FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

Our local Fire Department has other services to offer besides the normal emergency response. We also offer:

- Smoke alarm checks and battery changes: For those unable to reach their smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
- Safe place program: A place of refuge from weather, extreme temperature, or the State's Safe Baby Program.

- Station Tours: For those interested in equipment we have, how the equipment is used, and our daily routine.
- Comprehensive public education techniques, materials, and equipment to educate young and old in fire safety.
- Blood pressure checks: Checking and monitoring blood pressure between doctor visits. Cards are kept for tracking and updating your doctor at your next visit.
- File for Life Program: Help us help you by supplying you with a file for life. This record helps us retrieve your medication list and previous medical events if you need us in an emergency.
- Fire extinguisher training: We can assist you in training your company or your family in the use of fire extinguishers.
- Inspection and Plan Review Program: We begin with life safety surveys (fire inspections) during the last two weeks in April. We will assist you wherever we can to help make your business a fire save business.
- Other requested services: If you have any other questions, we will answer them or get the answer you deserve.

Remember, fire safety is for everyone! From inside our homes to the activities outdoors, fire safety helps everyone. To have a safe and happy Spring and Summer, we all must do our part to keep Eagle a fire safe community.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

The Town of Eagle received a grant from the Dept. of Natural Resources this year as a result of maintaining an effective recycling program.

All garbage cans must be 32 gallons or less. Please refrain from using large totes as they do not use automated equipment.

Please recycle all clean, dry paper products including junk mail, magazines and cereal boxes. All paper should be bagged or bundled. Cardboard must be flattened for recycling. Please do not put any recycling material in cardboard boxes. All bottles and cans should be placed in the yellow recycling bins.

Remember, all dogs in the Town of Eagle over five months old must be licensed by April 1st each year. The fee to license a dog that is not spayed or neutered is \$12. The fee for altered male or female dogs is \$8. There is an extra \$5 charge if dogs are not licensed by the deadline. Dog license applications are available at the Town Hall or by mail.
