Chairman's Corner . . . From Bob Kwiatkowski

I hope you are all having an enjoyable, safe summer. I would like to give you a brief update on some key issues that have been addressed.

Starting with the Road Maintenance Program, we will be repaving the roads in the Westwind Subdivision this summer at a cost of \$160,000.00 for the 1st lift. In 2008, Stonington Subdivision will be repaved at an estimated cost of \$175,000.00 for 2 lifts. Additionally, normal maintenance (crack filling) will also take place on other Town roads. A 2nd lift to Westwind Subdivision is scheduled to be applied in 2009 at an estimated cost of \$125,000.00. In 2010 we will pursue paving and road maintenance as needed. The previously mentioned subdivisions have not been repaved in quite some time. Our records indicate that seal coating was the last maintenance performed, which was in 1996. Town Supervisor Dan West and Town Treasurer Jim Pasterski have spent a considerable amount of time researching and putting this plan together.

With the help of Town Supervisor John Davis, we have added new technology to the office. We have upgraded an old computer and replaced it with a laptop. Our plan is to be able to utilize the laptop with the projector from the library to improve presentations to the town residents attending our meetings. Also upgraded was the telephone system with an additional line coming into the office to minimize the number of times residents are transferred to voicemail.

I have had numerous inputs from residents about the confusion surrounding the permit application processes. I am pleased to let you know this is an issue we are addressing. We are in the process of developing a checklist to expedite the process for various permits.

I would like to thank you for your continued support, comments and

suggestions and look forward to another update in our Fall newsletter.
