Chairman's Corner . . . From Bob Kwiatkowski

Just an update on the activities of the Town Board thus far. Our progress on the Smart Growth program is getting closer to completion. I encourage all residents to watch for the posting of the public hearing that will be held this fall. Residents can monitor the progress by going to our Town Web Site townofeagle@centurytel.net click on the "Smart Growth Link" and you can see the completed chapters related to Smart Growth. Regarding codification of the Town of Eagle's Zoning Code, the Town Board and Planning/Zoning will also have this activity completed for public hearing this fall. It too will be posted for review on the Town Web Site under its specific link. When completed, paper copies will also be available for inspection at the Municipal Library and Town Hall.

The Town Board will also be starting early to address the 2010 Town Budget. Based on the information coming out of Madison, the Town will be facing some "head winds" in our efforts to keep the Town of Eagle as the lowest taxing district in Waukesha County. The things that will impact the Town's budget the most will rely on what the State will pass in their budget. We anticipate that the Town will receive less in State Aid and Road Maintenance assistance. Additionally, within the proposed state budget is a provision to change the prevailing wage law. In essence, the town will have to pay contractors the prevailing wages for public contracts work done over \$2000.

These are things that your Town Board can not control and have a major impact on the Town Budget. In the last Town Newsletter, I showed a chart where monies paid from your property taxes go. Please remember that the Town Board only has control on the Town Tax. Your Town Board doesn't levy School, County or State taxes. The Town Board will be carefully evaluating

all proposed expenditures to make sure that we continue to assure the public safety and welfare of our community.

Fire Department

The Eagle Fire Department recently purchased an electric hose reel with 100-feet of hydraulic hose. Electric reels were also added to an existing manual hose reel and to an existing 250-foot electrical cord reel. In addition, three sets of quick couplers were purchased for interchanging extrication tools at an emergency scene.

This equipment makes it easier to use the Jaws of Life for vehicle extrication at an accident scene, which in turn allows for quicker patient contact and medical assistance.

The cost of the new equipment, over \$6,200, was paid for with money the Eagle Fire Department raised during Kettle Moraine Days over the past couple years. The members of the department thank you for your continued support of the Kettle Moraine Days festival; which allows the Eagle Fire Department to purchase equipment that will benefit rescue efforts throughout the



community.
