Looking back at 2007

Last year was busy and your Town Board and Planning/Zoning Commission spent a great deal of their free time to help accomplish some key goals. The Town Board presented a 2008 Budget that was well below the amount approved by the Governor. The town park pavilion was completed and opened for use thanks to the hard work of Jim Pasterski and Dan West. The first phase of the Town road program was completed. The Town took delivery of our new municipal plow truck. Grants were applied for and received for the paving of a handicap accessible path to the New Park Pavilion and for the Smart Growth Initiative (a joint grant applied for by both the Town and Village of Eagle). New committees were formed to focus on the Smart Growth initiative (John Davis and Dan West) and Town Ordinances (Arvy Rasmussen and John Davis). A Planning and Zoning Committee was created to review and update our Zoning ordinances (Jackie Lewis, Jim Samuels and myself). The Park and Recreation Dept supported by (Don Malek) had introduced several new programs that proved to be well received.

Inside the Town office the Town Board hired a new Town Clerk. The Town upgraded some information technology equipment and added an additional phone line to better serve our community. The Town Board hired a new town attorney due to the retirement of Elizabeth Adelman.

Looking forward to 2008

Yes, this will be another busy year for your Town Board. Smart Growth will be a major focus as it really covers all aspects of how the Town of Eagle will grow and look. We will be addressing not only residential development but commercial, recreational, and municipal as well. All of our Board members and committees members will be putting in some extra hours. We will work on phase II of the Town road program and resurface Stonington Subdivision and put the final paving lift in West Wind Subdivision. Work will continue with our basic road maintenance program. We need to review and revise our human resources policy and our permit applications procedure. With the increased popularity in our Park and Recreation offerings we will need to

relocate and create a new office space for the Town/Village Park and Recreation Director within the Town Office complex.

Upcoming Election . . .

A Primary Election has been scheduled for February 19, 2008. After the field is narrowed, the Spring Election will be held on April 1, 2008 at the Municipal Building. The April 1st ballot will include our local election of two Town Board Supervisors, as well as representatives to your district's School Board. The Presidential Election is November 4, 2008.

You may request an absentee ballot by application with a preprinted form or by letter for either or both elections. Your written request must list your voting address, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, and your signature. Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the Town Clerk's office. You can also personally go to the clerk's office, complete a written application, and vote an absentee ballot.

Local voters are reminded that all residents of Wisconsin are required to be registered. State voter registration rules require all municipalities – towns, villages and cities – to keep track of voter information in Wisconsin's new Statewide Voter Registration System (SVRS). To be registered in advance, voters can go to the clerk's office and present a Wisconsin driver's license or state ID card. Voters will still be able to register at the polls on Election Day with proper documentation. For more information about voter registration and upcoming elections, call the Town Hall.

Residents are advised that the collection crews serving the Town of Eagle do not use automated equipment and must manually lift all trash containers. All garbage must be in bags or cans. All garbage cans must be **32 gallons or less**. Please refrain from using large totes. Please recycle all clean, dry paper products including junk mail, magazines and cereal boxes. All paper should be bagged or bundled. Cardboard must be flattened for recycling. Please do not put any recycling material in cardboard boxes. All bottles and cans should be placed in the yellow recycling bins. Please remember to place your trash and recycling out for the pick-up crews by 6:00 a.m. on your delivery day or, save the chance that you may forget, do it the night before. In the event you were missed, please call John's Disposal at 262-473-4700 or 888-473-4701 and let them know of the oversight. If the crew can't come back that day, you do not have to leave the trash by the road, for your convenience, the crew will come right up to your home and collect the trash.
